BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE PROGRAMME

A programme designed to support Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and teachers at the start of their teaching career to become more proficient teachers of SEND. This package is suitable for teachers working in SEND specialist settings alongside mainstream primary and secondary.

This programme is designed to enhance the Early Career Framework curriculum, helping practitioners develop their own SEND Toolkit, enabling them to best meet the ever-changing needs of pupils with SEND. It will also allow them a forum to discuss pupil needs and share considerations/best endeavours to meet need, developing a truly inclusive approach to teaching.

Throughout the programme, ECTs will be expected to engage with research, evidenceinformed reviews and recommendations and participate in self-review activities.
